## ELECTION DAY IS NOVEMBER 3!

All people age 18 or older who are experiencing homelessness – whether they are street-based, living in shelters, or doubled-up in the homes of others – have the right to vote.

- You can register **online** with a valid driver's license or state ID.  
*It's okay if the address listed is outdated!*
- You can register **in person** on Election Day at the precinct polling place assigned to your current address.  
*Address can be a shelter or a friend/relative's home.*
- Chicago residents can register **in person** at the Loop Super Site (191 N Clark St.) now or any Early Voting site starting Oct. 14.

## **ELECTION DAY REGISTRATION & VOTING**

Tuesday, November 3

For in-person registration, you are required to provide two forms of identification, including one that shows proof of residence or a mailing address. If you are experiencing homelessness, a letter from a drop-in center, shelter, or the person in whose home you are living doubled-up is one acceptable form of ID. Make sure the letter states that you have permission to use this address to register to vote.
